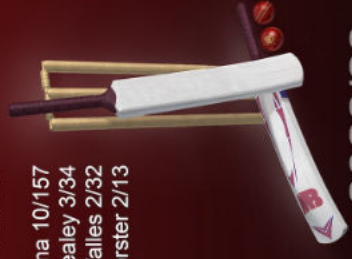

# TREASURER'S REPORT



The club recorded a \$12,573 trading deficit for season 2022/23. The club's true net cash position adjusted for amounts held on trust (coach travel and veterans golf trip) decreased by \$36,288 to the end of the financial year.

In contrast to recent seasons, it was a welcome change to start the season on time and without any restrictions on social activities. Most importantly though the dawn of the season saw us admitted to our new rooms which was a moment we had long been financially planning for.

With East Ringwood Junior Football Club (ERJFC) we jointly invested over \$45,000 in the equipment fit out of the new rooms. This is a major investment and sets us up with facilities our members should be able to enjoy for many years to come.

We also made some significant investments to support our players with over \$6,000 spent on a high-end bowling machine and \$15,000 at Lipscombe Park to upgrade the pitch and surroundings for the benefit of our 5th XI.

These major investments were made possible by some careful planning across the last five seasons, but the impact felt this season is less than it might have been in the covid impacted seasons due to unfettered access to our rooms.

This meant we could return to a normal social calendar and the revenue generation that comes with that resulting in a major increase in gross profit from social and bar sales.

Once again the generous support from sponsors was crucial in allowing us to meet the clubs day to day operating requirements. Led by Rick Forster and Alan Moss and assisted by Jason Eaton we were able to maintain sponsorship in line with the previous season's historical high. We can never take our sponsors for granted and so to each sponsor a huge thank you for their generous support and to our sponsorship team for managing these crucial partnerships.

Leigh Jones doubled down on the player sponsorship program which was introduced in the previous season. This program which we will hope to build on again next season generated additional sponsorship revenue compared to the previous season.

Member fees that do not cover on-field and coaching costs were again set at \$20 per game. It's taking longer and longer to collect player payments and at season's end, we have a number of outstanding collections. This is disappointing as no player should expect to play for free nor should we have to spend significant time as volunteers chasing players for payment.

We received a major grant from Cricket Australia for the Lipscombe Park pitch upgrade and ball machine purchase which covered 70% of these costs.

Rick Forster must be applauded again as he managed four Bunnings BBQ's which injected over \$8,000 to club coffers. Thanks to all those members that helped across the three days. Our members also again provided great support via the \$100 club raffle held in conjunction with the major reunion night which netted \$6,000.

Thank you to Max Moss who again diligently managed the club clothing returning our second profit in a row, a not insignificant achievement given the usual parlous state of clothing.

Having kept a strong handle on overheads the last few seasons this continued with total costs materially similar to previous seasons. The mix of costs changed with coaching/player costs reducing but increases in umpiring, training and ground hire costs neutralising any saving. Other playing and administration costs were again tightly managed and nearly identical to the previous few seasons.

Our Balance Sheet remains healthy even after the major investments made over the last 12 months. We have healthy cash reserves, significant stock holdings and a large receivable due from ERJFC with current liabilities less than 5% of current assets.

So we end the season in a strong position having made significant investments both on and off the playing arena. Next season the committee is looking to continue increasing our investment in junior development which started this season. We are fortunate to have worked ourselves into a position where we can make these investments we have without creating a shortage in working capital. However, we must guard against complacency and continue our hard work on the financial front to ensure our long term financial stability.

To the entire committee and all club members who help in official and unofficial capacities, you are what makes our club so great. To my wife Andrea, thank you for your support both as a player and as Treasurer, you continue to make my contribution possible.

## Financial Report Notes

These notes are provided in the interest of clarifying key aspects of the Ainslie Park Cricket Club Financial Report for the year ended 30 April 2023.

Notes are only provided where there is a change in income or expenditure from the previous financial year that is sufficient to warrant explanation:

1. Bar/canteen and social event gross profit was up 63% (~\$9,600) due to an increase in social functions and full season access to facilities.
2. Clothing gross profit was up 29% (~\$400) due to better management of clothing stock.
3. Fundraising was up 119% (~\$16,500) due to increased grants (~\$8,500), Bunnings BBQs (~\$4,000) and raffles (~\$2,000).
4. Membership was down 8% (~\$1,800) due to less junior and senior sides than the previous season.
5. Sponsorship was down 2% (~\$600).
6. Capital expenditure increased from \$nil to ~\$16,000 due to the Lipscombe Park upgrade.
7. Cleaning increased by 19% (~\$1,500) as we made the necessary investment to have the rooms cleaned more regularly by a professional cleaner.
8. Light, Power & Heating increased by 19% (~\$1,300) due to an increase in rates.
9. Non-playing equipment increased by 4.4x (~\$22,600) due to the room fit-out including kitchen, furniture and audio-visual.
10. Coach and player costs decreased by 28% (~\$7,900) due to a reduction in paid players.
11. Playing equipment costs increased by 8.6x (\$6,400) due to the purchase of a new bowling machine.
12. Ground hire increased by 66% (~\$3,100) due to increased rates from the Maroondah City Council.
13. Training expenses increased by 1.3x (~\$3,300) due to a full indoor pre-season.
14. Umpire fees increased by 71% (~\$2,400) due to umpires for the U/18 team and a full season.
15. The nets redevelopment as per previous seasons continues to be depreciated on a straight-line basis of \$8,000 per annum.

# COACH'S REPORT



Well, where do I start?! What a season. A genuine rollercoaster and an enjoyable ride from the start to the very end.

As if we hadn't had enough hurdles over the last few seasons, throw in a delayed move into the new rooms, followed by a month of La Niña interruptions. However, when we finally got into the rooms, it felt like the start of a new chapter for the club. The facilities were now more than adequate and home to everything we needed to continue moving forward as a community. There was a palpable sense of positivity on and off the field around the whole club before we'd even kicked off.

It was pleasing to continue our community initiative with the Glenallen School working bee. The timing was a little tricky this year, eventually falling in the first week of a huge finals campaign, but there were no excuses, no complaints, just people turning up to help out a cohort less fortunate than us. These initiatives help put many things into perspective. It's easy to take our physical or demographic situations for granted sometimes. The season kicked off with an important meeting. A bunch of senior players got together to formulate a game plan that would not only drive the 1st XI forward, but something we could implement club-wide to get all players on the same page. These plans help any player in any grade prepare for the next grade above, because when they get there, the playing style is the same and they can seamlessly slot in. All the guys in the meeting were on the same page, and we came out of it with a plan that we knew would work in any grade, in any situation, for any player. I hope they realise how important that was.

Two day cricket was back, finally! With the recent improvements in our short-form game, the return of Jake Tucker's bowling and the addition of two-dayers, we were always going to set the bar high. However, for the first time in a few years, we'd lost a bunch of handy players from the top few grades. It was not just the talent we were losing either, it included guys like Josh Bettess who was instrumental in building the culture of the team who would be sorely missed.

With departures though brings opportunities. Dillon Bettess had the opportunity to take the gloves again for the first time in 7 years and did an exceptional job. He'd already elevated himself to be one of the best bats in the competition, then also took on the keeping job and looked as though he'd never taken a break from it. A key bowling spot was also up for grabs and Ethan Stone did just that, making his debut in round 1 and playing every game in the 1s. Rowan Peters was earmarked for 1st XI cricket this season despite committing to captain the 2s. That lasted a week, he was too good, came up and had a solid year.

We snuck the first two rounds in before a La Niña forced break. A decent showing against South Croydon in round 1 where Dillon and Tom got us over the line with 60's each. Then a forgettable day against Norwood, getting bowled out for 97, left us 1-1 with the next two weeks washed out. The rain was relentless, not much opportunity to train outside of a couple of indoor sessions, but it did give us a chance to reset.

The next three rounds produced three wins, two of them emphatic not only in style but context. Dillon Bettess notched another 1st XI century supported by Rowan Peters to knock off East Ringwood, then we squared off against two of our eventual finals opposition, North Ringwood and Montrose. These two teams were always going to require performances close to our best to beat them.

North Ringwood were undefeated. They batted first and posted a decent total of 216, Jake Tucker with his first 5 wicket haul of the season. The run chase was well executed, with Trent Sier and Dillon Bettess putting on 56 for the first wicket, then consistent partnerships not only pushed the game forward, but quickly. Jake backed up the 5 fa with 54 off 48, Rowan smashed 60 off 71 and before we knew it, the target was reached in 58.1 overs. A big statement.

Montrose followed and a target of 266 was set after Montrose batted well. This time Dave and Dillon set the tone with a 141 run opening stand, Max elevated to number three ticked it over, and then Tom and Aydn iced the game with class, not to mention 9 overs to spare.

The season then threatened to be derailed by a winless, very inconsistent 3-week block of one-day cricket. Good spells of bowling from Whitey, Ethan and DK kept Lilydale to 192 in round 8, then a poor batting display lost us the game. The batting recovered to post 232 the next week after Dillon (84) and Dave (61) set us up again. Dave then started with 2 early wickets, but the bowling generally let us down and Montrose chased us down easily. The batting consistency eluded us again as North Ringwood beat us comfortably the next week. DK, Jimmy and Jake all bowled well, and Tom and Max's 50s weren't enough to save us.

A heat-out in week 1 of round 11 vs South Croydon gave us a chance to get together and have an open, honest chat about how we'd been going, re-focusing on the game plan and clearly defining roles for the team. It seemed to spark us back to form again. A maiden 1st XI century from DK (109\*) headlined a win against South, then a demolition

job of Norwood followed. A near outright win with all batsmen contributing to an Aydn Sier (88) led total of 8/315. After only having 1 wicket to date, I found some form with the ball and Ethan took 6 wickets across Norwood's two innings. Another even team effort saw us past Wantirna South in round 13.

The last round was a danger game against relegation battling East Ringwood. A win would see us into a home final, but we didn't bat well. Jake (48), myself and Whitey inflicted some late damage to get us 153. Tucks and I made early inroads but then East Ringwood looked to have the game won, 6 overs to go, 14 runs to win, 3 wickets in hand. A couple of boundaries, then a couple of wickets made it a thrilling finish... 5 to win off the last 22 balls with 1 wicket in hand. Whitey and I were the bowlers and after a maiden in the second last, Josh White was to bowl the final over with only 3 runs to win and a home final riding on it. Two balls later he's the hero, Jimmy Hunter taking the catch that locked in an Elimination Final vs Montrose at Ainslie Park.

## THE FINALS

I loved the feel around the club during finals. Packed Thursday night dinners with Troy and Jo dominating in the kitchen, great numbers at training, Saturday night pasta nights at the club with lots of people hanging around. Big energy and an amazingly positive feel. Thanks to all the people who trained, even when they weren't playing, and those who helped out in general.

A settled 1st XI team went into finals in good form. Our two-day batting form was great and our bowlers had found some consistency. We'd said during the chat before the South Croydon game that if we were going to win it this year, which we genuinely believed we could, we'd win it off the back of team performances and partnerships with both bat and ball.

We lost the toss and were sent in by Montrose, then didn't really look back. Dillon again gave us a great

start, making 64 in a 94 run stand with Tom. Aydn (42) pushed it along in another big 109 run partnership with Tom. Another partnership, this time Jake not mucking around hitting 48 off 28 in a 52 run partnership with Tom. Eventually, Tommy fell trying to go for more quick runs but he'd done the damage, the architect of our 7/301 with a brilliant maiden 1st XI century, making 116. The result was a grind, but comfortable as the bowlers all played their role, Ethan the pick with 3 wickets. Our fielding was good, we held our catches and got 3 run outs.

Lilydale away in a prelim was always going to be a challenge, they'd been top 2 all year. We'd lost to them in a one-dayer, however our form against them in recent seasons at their ground has actually been strong.

Batting first again, we were in a bit of trouble losing both Dillon and Dave early. Then Aydn and Tom were brilliant, putting on 148 together. After Aydn fell for 58, Tom, Row and Max had pushed us to 195 before Tommy eventually got out after another great knock of 91. His tempo was excellent, knowing exactly when to attack and when to defend. Jake again pushed the game forward quickly, another rapid 43 off 32. Mango and I managed a couple of late cameos to get us to 272.

Jake and I both got an early wicket to have Erulkar and leading run scorer Muthalif back in the shed at 2/15. Ethan broke the next partnership, quickly followed by Jake getting Lilydale's captain Thompson. 4/97 and from there, Pearce was the danger man as he can take the game away quickly. He had a brain fade which opened up a chance, and Josh White pounced on it, running Pearce out to leave them 6 down still needing 85 runs. From there we took consistent wickets, Jake was outstanding on a big stage, his second 5 wicket haul of the season with 5/49. We were into the Grand Final!

It was a huge week leading up to the big dance. There was a great buzz around the club after the 4th XI winning the flag, congratulations to all those

guys again! The under 14-2's were also through, which gave us a great way to start each morning of our game, with most players coming to watch them play before heading to North Ringwood. Brilliant to see them win as well!

North Ringwood away has to be the toughest assignment in Trollope in recent seasons, but we knew if we stuck to the game plan we'd be in with a good chance. I lost the toss and the North Ringwood captain couldn't have been quicker to say they were batting.

What was expected to be a 37 degree day never got to that, and turned out to be a great day to bowl. The ball was moving around and Jake started brilliantly, taking the first 3 wickets to put North on the back foot at 2/8 and then 3/22. Ethan again bowled beautifully, taking the next two key wickets of Peter-Budge and Scott. North Ringwood in deep trouble at 5/66.

I don't know how many people knew at the time, but Dave Killen was pretty banged up going into the Grand Final. He'd injured his foot, copped a bad head knock batting in the prelim, and then also strained his side bowling in that game. He put it all behind him to bowl a handy spell in the Grand Final. He took our 6th wicket, then Jake came back on to claim 2 more for another 5 wicket haul. Back-to-back 5 fa's in a prelim and Grand Final is something else. I think he's the best bowler in the comp when he's on, and he proved that over those two weeks. Josh White came on and bowled a great spell to finish off the innings, taking the last two wickets when North Ringwood had just started to threaten to get away. They were all out for 168. We had 14 overs to face overnight and unfortunately lost Dave early, but Dillon and Tom navigated the rest and we finished the day 1/24. 145 runs to win.

A lot of hard work was done early on day 2. North Ringwood were never going to give it to us easily, they bowled tight and disciplined, as they always do. Tom and Dillon withstood a mountain of pressure and ticked the score over patiently. It was

fitting that Dillon top scored for the match with 58, another great innings to cap off a brilliant season where he led the competition for runs scored. Well deserved Dillon.

Tom fought hard all day for us. They threw everything at him and he didn't budge until the win was in sight, but was out for 45. He'd had a mammoth finals series where he was at the crease for 76% (568 of 745) of our runs (thanks Bluey). This brought Max and Rowan together, and the rest will go down in Ainslie Park folklore.

Max Moss is one of those guys that every club hopes to have. A selfless person, a club and team man that'll do anything required of him to help others out. He played a number of different roles for us; at number 3 a couple of times and did well, at 7 or 8 sometimes when Jake was elevated to hit a few, but mostly at 6 to play a finisher type role. Moving around like that can be frustrating sometimes, but he never complained and just wanted to play his role for the team.

Rowan seemed to find a greater level of belief in his game this year. He knows what he can do now, and he's learnt what he needs to do to be more consistent. Both of these guys showed maturity beyond their years in pursuit of the 33 more runs we needed. Rowan waited for the right balls to hit and managed Ridgwell nicely. Max went in and pushed the game forward, pouncing on anything in his area. They ran well together and batted for each other. Then with the scores level, that sweetly timed Max Moss pull shot went to the boundary and Ainslie Park people poured onto the ground from everywhere, as did many, many emotions.

The scenes were euphoric. We'd put Ainslie Park back at the top of the RDCA after 23 years. I've never been hugged that many times in my life. It'd been 17 years since my last premiership, my first as a captain. Lifting up that trophy in front of all those Ainslie people was the proudest moment I've ever had on a sporting field.

Like the current 1st XI premiership players before them I hope this group can nurture their friendship and support each other as they look to fulfill their potential as Ainslie Park cricketers.

To Duggie, Abba, Coma and everyone else who captained the 4s, congratulations on your amazing victory over Wantirna to bring the flag home and to Leroy, a massive congratulations from myself and the 5s on your sides' success and win over North Ringwood to bring home the Premiership that has eluded Ainslie for so long.

# GIRLS STAGE 2 - STARS

Isabelle Litchfield, Isabel Wheeler, Jasmine Freeman and Elside Dohle formed the contingent from Ainslie Park and all performed very well with Isabel Wheeler collecting the RDCA Player of the Carnival Award for the U12 girls.

When the new year got underway we found ourselves with a back to back fixture against South Belgrave, who up until that point had been

holding second place on the ladder. Our first game finished in a tense draw that could have easily gone our way. While it wasn't a win, the girls could be proud of the composure late in the game and with that came a feeling that we would be able to beat South Belgrave in the next match - and we did just that.

Riding a bit of confidence, we took on an undefeated St Johns Tecoma side in difficult conditions with a bit of drizzle around throughout the game. After losing the toss we bowled first and pushed them further than any other team had, up to that point of the season, taking six wickets. Isabel Wheeler finished her spell two wickets in a row, and stranded on a hat-trick. Unfortunately we fell well short with the bat.

Now at the business end of the season we remained optimistic. We had two away games against Warrandyte to finish the season, they wouldn't be easy, but if we managed to win at least one of them we'd be in the box seat to sneak into fourth place and play finals.

In the first of those contests we put together a comprehensive performance in the field, including a couple of catches and run-outs. Chasing 93 for the win, we finished our 20 overs with 113 runs on the board and fourth place in the bag, with a real possibility of snatching third place from Warrandyte the following week. Unfortunately the result in the final game didn't go our way, finishing 19 runs short and in fourth place.

In the semi-final we once again lost to the eventual premiers, St Johns Tecoma. Despite the loss, it was a really exceptional result for the girls to make finals in the first season of Stage 2 cricket. Something they should be very proud of and set their sights on bigger and better things in seasons to come.

It's never easy moving up to a new grade with significant differences in the rules and the extra challenge of using a hard ball. Adding to that, forming a merged team with the Croydon Ranges

# UNDER 14/2



Going into this season I didn't know what to expect. I was travelling around Europe and missed most of the pre-season resulting in only seeing the boys a couple of weeks before round 1. I can't thank Darren and the parents for chipping in whilst I was away. From seeing a couple of sessions and working with the boys I knew bowling was going to be our major strength. We were super excited to welcome the 4 Lilydale boys Mitch, Kalen, Cooper and Luke who brought laughter, friendship and talent to our side. Our site was Captained by Taj Johnstone and Vice Captained by Jack Evans who together were able to form a well-connected cricket side.

My major priority as coach of this side was to not only improve these young men as cricketers but as young men. Forcing this to continue to challenge themselves through resilience, friendships and becoming leaders.

We started beautifully in Round 1 knocking off Wonga Park Convincingly. We were able to roll them for 46 where almost everyone took a wicket. This gave our group great confidence starting the year as many of the group had never played with each other before. The group started as total strangers but after our win friendships were made and a premiership contender was formed.

We followed the next few weeks with wins over Chirnside Park and North Ringwood where we won convincingly. As a coach, I tried to implement different strategies and difficult training sessions to continue to improve the boys as our opponents were not testing us. During this period we flipped the batting and bowling order and we saw every player play a major part in winning. Round 5 was the first major test. We played a strong Mooroolbark side and we came from behind to win the game. Leading into Christmas we were undefeated and sitting pretty at the top of the ladder. As all young 14 boys would we became a very confident group. My biggest challenge as a coach was to try to teach and make the boys understand the difference between confidence and arrogance.

After a long and well-deserved break, we played East Ringwood. Our boys got carried away and were bowled out for a miserable 104. It was fair to say we had got ahead of ourselves and that there was plenty of work to do as a group. The rain saved us the week after as the match got washed out resulting in a draw. Following that we had a convincing win over Wonga Park and Vermont setting up for a top-of-table clash with our rivals Mooroolbark. That by far was not only the biggest challenge for the group but a huge challenge for me as a coach. We bowled out for an embarrassing 64 which eventually resulted in us losing the game. We understood that we had let the ball drop a bit and needed to switch back to working harder at training. I honestly believe that losing that match to Mooroolbark was a blessing in disguise as it forced us to work harder and work on certain areas as a group.

In the first semi-final, we were able to beat Glen Waverley comfortably. It was a complete performance by the group which saw everyone play a major role with either bat, ball or in the field. We made 197 which was our highest score in 4 matches and bowled out Glen Waverley for 85 resulting in us making the grand final.

We understood the task ahead as East Ringwood had troubled us with their medium pace bowlers. We lost medium-paced East Ringwood declared to bat. East Ringwood got off to a fast start being 0-32 off 10. To our boy's credit, we were able to fight back taking 3 wickets for 1 run, which resulted in us taking control of the match. We ended up bowling East Ringwood all out for 97. Chasing 97 may seem easy on paper but is a hard task. We knew if we batted smart and took our time we would get the result. We eventually got East Ringwood's score of 97 in 30 overs with only the loss of 4 wickets resulting in us being premiers.

I know I didn't touch on any personal efforts in my recap but I wanted to highlight the way we played as a team and how it was never up to one player. The friendships that were made and the resilience these boys showed throughout the year made me

so proud as a coach. Ainslie Park CC's future looks very bright with these young men as your future leaders.

Winning our bowling average of 18 wickets with an average of 6.72 was Mitch Cliff. I threw Mitch in the deep end with a tactic of bowling his first change as an off-spinner. Mitch dominated during the year with the ball with his dot ball pressure resulting in wickets.

The most improved player at the club was Kaelan Baker-Flett. Kaelan went from an average of 6 the year before to 15. Kaelan's aggression when batting and his accuracy while bowling were great to see. Kaelan was also willing to listen and took every bit of opportunity to learn.

We had Taj Johnstone, Jack Evans and Cooper Doughty represent the RDCA in the rep Carnival.

We had a total of 9 players averaging under 20 with the ball.
